### **Instructional Interventions**

- Untimed assignments
- Oral administration of tests
- Use of large print
- Use of a word bank
- Short answers accepted for lengthy essay
- Project accepted for major written assignments
- Teacher or assistant records answers when given orally
- Accept manuscript or cursive writing
- Supply copies of notes
- Instructions given in Braille
- Direct instruction
- Generalization instruction
- Maintenance instruction

#### **Environmental Adjustments**

- Proximity seating
- Small group instruction
- Study carrel available
- Interpreter

#### **Curricular Modifications**

- Textbooks on tape
- Textbooks in Braille
- Adjustment in performance criteria
- Use of a competency checklist

#### **Scheduling Modifications**

- Academics scheduled at appropriate times for student
- Scheduled breaks
- Testing done at the time of day beneficial for the student
